11th Annual Love Your Neighbor Day will be held on September 20, 2025 – Volunteers Are Needed!



The Christian Church of Villa Park and other area churches and community members will be working together again this year to hold the 11th annual Love Your Neighbor Day on Saturday, September 20, 2025 (rain date September 27, 2025). This is an important ministry of CCVP which only continues with the support from our members, family and friends through volunteering. On Love Your Neighbor Day 2024, 150 volunteers came together to help a total of 34 homeowners in need of assistance in Lombard and Villa Park in doing yard work and repairs to the exterior of their homes. We hope to be able to help just as many people this year.

We know that God calls us to love our neighbors. LYND is an opportunity to put our love into action and show God's love by showing up at a neighbor's home and providing much needed assistance. Most of our applicants have been unable to keep up with projects around their home due to physical limitations (age or health problems) or financial limitations.

You can help these neighbors in need of assistance by filling out a volunteer sign-up sheet and agreeing to volunteer on September 20, 2025 (rain date September 27, 2025). You can return the sign-up sheet to Doris Carter or leave it in the church office. While some of the work done includes repairs to the exterior of the homes, most of the work done is yard work which doesn't require any specific construction skills. Repairs done last year included painting, replacing windows, rebuilding rotten decks and stairs to make them safe and usable, replacing rotten soffit and fascia, plumbing work, replacing screens, and washing windows.

Our homeowners expressed their gratitude for the blessing of having volunteers to help them out with jobs they were unable to do themselves. The volunteers came away with a great deal of satisfaction from having helped their neighbor.

If you don't feel like you have the ability to do the physical work at a neighbor's home, Ruth Martin is in need of volunteers who will help with the food – setting up coffee and breakfast treats at the morning gathering and/or delivering lunches to the teams on the job site.

It would be very helpful to the LYND Planning Team to receive your volunteer commitments as soon as possible so that they can let some of our applicants know that there will be enough volunteers so that their applications can be accepted. Volunteer sign-up sheets are available at church, on the homepage of the church's website, or you can email Doris Carter (dcarter340@aol.com) and she will send you one. Contact Doris if you have any questions. Volunteers do not need to be a member of CCVP or any other area church so we courage you to invite your family and friends to join you.

A Lesson of Love

(06/19/25)

It was, maybe, three months ago when I began to "hear" this thought. I knew the feeling. It seemed to get stronger and louder.

One morning, with barely a whisper, I shared a piece of the thought, but I stayed silent thereafter. (I lacked courage to say more.)

I kept thinking that I should say something to the one that shows how to lead or to the other that guides life through the Word, but I lacked belief (that it really was the Holy Spirit).

Then I told myself to send a letter to the one (that used to guide here) and an email to the other, but I lacked hope (that God really wanted me to do this).

With the letter, I thought that I'd send it next week then the next week and so on. With the email, I decided to just call. Then I changed my mind because I wanted to show my respect and ask in person. And, then, I realized that I could just ask her on the 21st, but time ran out for that friend, but especially for me (in the opportunity to obey the Holy Spirit). Now, I lack confidence in saying anything to anyone. (I failed.)

Day after week, the Holy Spirit kept "bugging" me to speak up and ask. To just ask. Help God to preserve the legacy of CCVP. But I never did find my voice. (I, apparently, lacked trust.)

Well, I may have failed by staying silent, but God did not fail in His faithfulness; in His love for His children.

Despite the back and forth in going to the friend's wake, I decided to obey the Holy Spirit, this time, by not cancelling my bus reservation, on the third attempt, and to go to the wake.

Moments after I walked into the wake area, I was in shock at seeing all these (shiny) writings laid before me on tables. The sunlight was shining "perfectly" on those writings!

(These were the writings of our dear respected friend that has gone Home to be with our Lord and Savior; our God.)

It was weird. I was drawn to go see the writings up close, but I was unsure if it was okay for me to go look. But then I figured it was kind-of like how families put up pictures of their loved one at wakes. It must be okay to go look at the writings.

So, I went to the first essay and looked. I could only read the first page. I didn't think I could touch the essay pages. Then a friend came up and was going to take pictures of the pages. I was so excited about being allowed to do that! (I began to do the same.) As I was still looking, there was this one that completely caught my...something.

I began to read the essay and, as I read her words, I heard her voice. Her love for Jesus was alive and well! I could not stop reading! It was like I was mesmerized.

I realized that, before me, was her testimony at one point while with CCVP. The legacy of the Christian Church of Villa Park was "born".

Thank you, my Lord, my God for using my disobedience and turning it into a blessing for your glory!!! Now, I pray, asking, for your help, Lord Jesus, in having the courage, the belief, the hope, the confidence, the trust AND the love to share this with your Church. (Love I refuse to lack!)
