They can let us better evaluate how we feel about all that we are engaged in, something that is often impossible when we are in the midst of our regular routines. As we rest, let us dream of what God is calling us to and what God is no longer calling us to. As we take breaks at home and around the world, let us imagine new ways of connecting that do not require us to be in the same physical space to develop and sustain deep, faithful relationships. As our time fills with other things, let us be honest with ourselves and one another about what we are not willing to take back up.

Summer is a time of dreams, of rest, of possibility. Let us see where our dreams will take us.

Love Your Neighbor Day 2022 Will Be Held on September 17, 2022 Volunteers Are Needed!



The Christian Church of Villa Park and other area churches will be working together again this year to hold the 8th annual Love Your Neighbor Day on Saturday, September 17, 2022 (rain date September 24, 2022). This is an important ministry of CCVP which only continues with the support from our members, family and friends through volunteering. On Love Your Neighbor Day 2021 over 130 volunteers provided assistance to 28 homeowners.

We know that God calls us to love our neighbors. LYND is an opportunity to put our love into action and show God's love by showing up at a neighbor's home and providing much needed assistance. Most of our applicants have been unable to keep up with projects around their home due to physical limitations (age or health problems) or financial limitations.

You can help these neighbors in need by filling out a volunteer sign-up sheet and agreeing to volunteer on September 17, 2022 (rain date September 24, 2022). All work will again be outside this year.

If you don't feel like you have the ability to do the physical work at a neighbor's home, Ruth Martin is in need of volunteers who will help with the food – setting up coffee and breakfast treats at the morning gathering and/or delivering lunches to the teams on the job site.

It would be very helpful to the LYND Planning Team to receive your volunteer commitments as soon as possible so that they can let some of our applicants know that there will be enough volunteers that their applications can be accepted.
