Where do we find grace? How do we see and know God and our own belovedness? I hope that you have a few places or people or moments that spring to mind. But I also wonder...why do we only have a few of those?

We proclaim that God is always with us and I deeply believe that to be true. However, I also know that I don't always deeply *experience* that to be true. Why is that? Why am I (and maybe you) only able to sense the presence of God and

God's grace in particular moments and ways?

Maybe I'm just not looking for it. I get caught up in the day-to-day things I have going on, the ordinariness of my moments and actions, the dependability of my relationships, and I stop seeing the sacred. I can't live every moment in a state of awe. There are too many other emotions that need to be expressed too. But still... maybe I need to stop expecting all my encounters with grace to be of peace and awe and certainty. Maybe God and grace are also found in the grocery store checkout or the school morning drop off, in my worries about schedules and wishes the laundry would do itself. Maybe all I need to do is remind myself that God is there, always.

Not to say that that's easy. That's probably the hardest part. It's much easier to keep God and grace contained in their own little category and space. Sunset on the beach: There's God. The quiet stillness first thing in the morning: God. Sunday morning: definitely God. But the rest of the time it's easier to just not notice.

But what happens to us (to our lives, our relationships, our faith) when we only locate grace "over there," not right here and right now. Does the rest of our faith only play out over there too? Do we stop being able to pause long enough even in those identified times and places to really experience God and God's grace? Can we truly see God's grace wherever we are?

8th Annual Love Your Neighbor Day



The 8th annual Love Your Neighbor Day 2022 on September 17, 2022 was a success thanks to the support, prayer and participation of CCVP and 10 other churches in Lombard and Villa Park. Over 140 volunteers came out for LYND 2022 and we were able to help 23 homeowners in the Lombard/Villa Park area. Check out our Love Your Neighbor Day Facebook page to see photos from the day.

The work that was done included rebuilding a section of fence, repairing steps, repairing soffit and fascia, installing new window frames, tearing down a dilapidated shed and fence, exterior painting, power washing, and lots of yard clean up and weeding and trimming of bushes and trees (we filled almost 400 yard bags and bundled lots of limbs). We left every home in better shape than when we arrived. However, the impact of LYND goes well beyond the actual work done on the homes. Here is an excerpt from a message from one of our homeowners: “I cannot express how much I appreciate the service your team generously gave me today. I feel so much lighter looking at my yard cleaned up, and am grateful for the tar mending on my foundation. I know how hard the work is...I am grateful for all your kind volunteers and this program! I look forward to paying it forward. May God bless all of you!”

We were again able to cover the cost of materials and supplies needed for doing the needed work for our homeowners with donated funds. We were also able to provide breakfast treats for our volunteers and lunches for our volunteers and homeowners with the contributions made by local businesses, including Chick-fil-A in Elmhurst, Mike’s Meat Market, Kuppies Bakery, McDonald’s, and Jewel in Villa Park, and Lilac Bakery in Lombard (and thanks to the efforts of Ruth Martin in soliciting these contributions). Lakeshore Recycling donated yard waste stickers, the Village of Lombard donated the use of a dumpster, and Waste Management picked up yard waste for our Lombard homeowners for free. This year Lombard Christian Reformed Church made a \$2,000 contribution to LYND and we recently received another grant in the amount of \$2,000 from the Village of Villa Park.

Love Your Neighbor Day continues to be a vital ministry for CCVP which is embraced by the community. Thanks to CCVP members Dan Carter, Ruth Martin and Heidi Gomez who served on the Planning Team, to Josh Reed and Betty Prorak who served as team leaders, and to Heidi’s daughters Haley, Daniela, Sofia and Melina, Laura and Amelia Reed, Tina Amadeo and her parents, and Joan Fuller who helped with food preparation and delivery.
